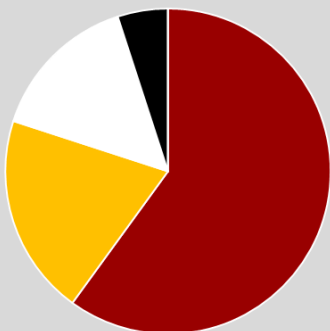
We are a Title I school where students are taught by committed professionals using a variety of teaching strategies.
