Elementary School



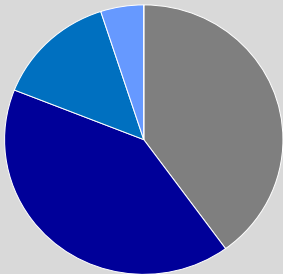
Millbrook was originally built in 1953. A new building was built in 1993 and then the newest addition was added in 2006. We are looking forward to reconstruction of our school which is set to begin in early 2020. We currently serve grades 4K-5th grade and serve a population of about 580 students.



Millbrook is consistently recognized as a Palmetto Gold and Silver Award winning school and has been named a Red Carpet School (2010-2013) for our friendly atmosphere and outstanding customer service. We were recently awarded the National ESEA Distinguished Schools Award for our work in closing the achievement gap between African Americans and Caucasian students.



Millbrook is heavily-focused on reading success. We provide literacy interventions through Read 180, System 44 and a reading interventionist to address gaps in literacy for all students.

Afterschool care is available each day from 2:30-6:00 p.m. Monday-Friday right here at our school. Quest Zone is operated by the Sunshine House Child Care Center and provides on-site afterschool homework help and engaging activities for our students.



Parent and community involvement is always encouraged. Millbrook has an active and highly-involved School Improvement Council and Parent Teacher Organization. In addition, various civic organizations and volunteer groups lend their time and talents to support our students' success.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

We offer many parent involvement nights throughout the school year including a literacy night, Father-Daughter Dance night, and Mother-Son Movie night. We partner with community members and have a PAWS reading program. We provide opportunities for family members to participate during the school day.



SPECIAL NEEDS

We are committed to a quality educational experience for all students, including struggling learners and those with special needs. We have 12 teacher aides, a reading recovery teacher, and a full-time nurse.
