Scholars and their families do not incur any cost for participation outside of traditional public school fees.



Following high school graduation, scholars may continue at USC Aiken or transfer credits to another college or university. Scholars retain eligibility for state scholarships.



Public school transportation is provided via area hubs. Scholars may also be dropped off and picked up through car line, or, once they obtain a license, drive themselves to campus.



Extra curricular activities, including sports and band, are open to students at their zoned school of attendance, if transportation is provided.



Leadership opportunities available for scholars include School Improvement Council, Superintendent's Student Advisory Council, and various clubs.



The safety of our scholars is paramount.


The school is currently located inside the Ruth Patrick Science Education Center, a K-12 facility.


K-12 educators and administrators lead the immersive and guided experience into a collegiate environment.
