Elementary School




Warrenville is a 58,800 square foot elementary school built in 1995 in the heart of the Horse Creek Valley area of Aiken County, which extends from Vaucluse to the Georgia state line on the Savannah River. Our school was named after Charles Warren Davis when he bought the mill in the 1890's. Built to accommodate 500 students, Warrenville has 19 regular classrooms, a music room, an art room, a PE room, a central workroom, a media/library facility, an office complex, two speech rooms, two computer labs, and a cafeteria. Warrenville also has an outdoor classroom and three playgrounds to extend learning.



Warrenville has been recognized as a Palmetto Gold and Silver school from (2006-2007) and (2009-2010). Warrenville has also been recognized as a Red Carpet School from (2009-2012) for our friendly atmosphere and outstanding customer service.



Warrenville strives for excellence. We are tracking success to reach our goal of 80% of kindergarten through fifth grade students reading on grade level by the end of the 2019-2020 school year. At the end of the 2018-2019 school year, 67% of kindergarten, 76% of first, 52% of second, 59% of third, 60% of fourth, and 65% of fifth grade students were reading on grade level according to Fountas and Pinnell and HMH Reading Inventory benchmark assessments.







Afterschool care is available each day from 2:15 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. Quest Zone is operated by the Sunshine House Child Care Center and provides on-site afterschool homework help and engaging activities for our students.



Parent and community involvement is always encouraged. Warrenville has an active and highly-involved School Improvement Council and Parent Teacher Organization. In addition, various civic organizations and volunteer groups lend their time and talents to support our students' success.
