## Requirements

• Bachelor's Degree

### <u>Initial Certificate Requirements (First 3 years):</u>

- Submission of a complete certification application packet
- Presenting passing scores on the content area examination(s)
- Receive Statement of Eligibility by securing employment in a South Carolina public school and completion of the next available pre-service institute

The initial alternative route certificate is valid for one academic year. The certificate can be renewed annually for two additional academic years based on successful progress in completing the program requirements and continuous employment in a South Carolina public school.

### <u>Professional Certificate Requirements:</u>

- Complete 3 successful years of teaching in SC public school
  - Complete Induction year (ADEPT)
- Complete 3 courses from the list of core courses approved by the SCDE within first 3 years of teaching with a B or better
  - Passing score on Principle of Learning and Teaching exam

## Steps to apply to PACE

**Step 1:** Complete and submit an on-line PACE application through the Educator Portal

<u>Step 2:</u> Submit <u>Official Transcripts</u> from all colleges attended.

<u>Step 3:</u> Once approval is received, schedule, take, and pass the appropriate <u>ETS Praxis II Subject Assessment</u>.

<u>Step 4:</u> After you receive your official passing score report from ETS, schedule and complete the <u>Fingerprinting Process and Criminal Records</u> Review.

**Step 5:** Non-refundable \$105 fee through the CATS Portal, Wait to receive a letter from our office granting permission to seek employment as a PACE candidate. This letter is called a Statement of Eligibility (SOE).

**Step 6:** Secure employment with a S.C. public school district.

**<u>Step 7:</u>** Attend and pass the 10-day PACE Pre-service Institute to secure your initial PACE educator certificate.

- Participants can complete the Masters in Innovation and Divergent Learning after achieving certification (27 graduate hours are completed during the APEC Program).
- 4 graduate modules along with a work embedded teacher residency are the foundation of the program.
- APEC Fellows receive coaching support and professional development during their first three years of teaching.
- There are tuition costs to APEC Fellows as they also pursue a master's degree but scholarships are available.
- Participants work with a financial aid counselor to develop an individualized plan.



### **Requirements**

- Bachelor's degree in Studio Art, Fine Arts with Visual Arts or Graphic Arts
- GPA of 2.75
- Passing score on the Praxis 2: Art Content and Analysis

### **Program Process**

- Submit application for Converse Special Status Student and an application for the Converse Teacher Education Program. (up to 12 credit hours)
- Submit a Statement of Disclosure of Felonies and Misdemeanors
- Submit a Statement of Disclosure explaining that the applicant did not student teach in a traditional teacher preparation program or attempt to complete another alternative certification program
- Submit a passing score on the Praxis 2: Art Content and Analysis and GPA of 2.75 with a 2.50 the minimum for provisional acceptance. The GPA in the content area major or the GPA in the last sixty hours of coursework may be used to meet this requirement
- Submit a current, all-clear FBI/SLED fingerprint background check.
- Complete application with State Department of Education
- submit a conferred Bachelor's degree in Studio Art, Fine Arts with Visual Arts or Graphic Arts Cognate from an accredited institution with transcripts from all institutions on file with the Converse Graduate Admissions Office

### **Requirements**

- Bachelor's degree or higher
- Submit your official college or university transcripts to the American Board
- Pass a standard background check.

### **Exams Needed:**

- Pass the Professional Teaching Knowledge exam
   (PTK). This exam will be taken on a computer and
   must be completed at a Pearson VUE testing center.
   The exam will consist of 150 multiple choice questions
   and a writing component. We suggest you take this
   exam before your subject area exam
- Pass the ABCTE exam. This exam will be taken on a computer and must be completed at a Pearson VUE testing center. We suggest taking this exam after you complete your PTK exam.



## American Board

### Step 1:

- •Complete all ABCTE requirements and achieve passing scores on the required American Board examination(s)
- •Submit a completed South Carolina Certification Application, non-refundable \$105 Processing Fee
- •Submit Official Copies of all college/university transcripts to the South Carolina Department of Education | Office of Educator Services
- •Complete the <u>Fingerprinting Process and Criminal Records Review</u>.
- <u>Step 2:</u> With a South Carolina American Board Statement of Eligibility, a candidate may seek employment as a classroom teacher *only in the* American Board *content area*. South Carolina's Center for Educator Recruitment, Retention, and Advancement provides a listing of teaching employment opportunities statewide as well as an online application that is accepted by most South Carolina school districts.
- Step 3: To receive the first South Carolina Alternative Route License, a candidate must obtain a letter of intent to hire from a South Carolina public school or eligible charter school and provide verification of the offer to the Office of Educator Services through the American Board Confirmation of Employment form.
- Step 4: To advance to a standard South Carolina Professional License, an American Board candidate must:
- •Teach successfully for three academic years in a South Carolina public or charter school only.
- Complete the induction and summative evaluation requirements (ADEPT)
- •Take and pass the Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) for Grades 9 12.

## Teach for America



- Bachelor's Degree with minimum GA of 2.5
- U.S. Citizenship or Employment Authorization

Eligible candidates will be granted a one-year, alternate-route certification in their teaching field, with an option for a second year, based upon verification of successful performance. Individuals who wish to continue as teachers in the South Carolina public schools beyond the two-year commitment to TFA will be provided an option to qualify for professional certification by completing additional South Carolina requirements.

### What are the requirements for a South Carolina initial teaching certification?

By the first day of school, all corps members must:

- Pass the Praxis II exam
- Submit an application and \$105 fee to the state of South Carolina Department of Education
  - Complete <u>Darkness to Light</u> child abuse online training
    - Complete a state and FBI background check
  - Submit official transcripts with degree conferred and at least 2.5 GPA
    - Submit social security card



## Teach for America

### What happens to my certification after the corps?

- Your initial teaching certificate in South Carolina will remain valid for a third year in a South Carolina classroom, if you decide to continue to teach an additional year.
- Once you have completed three years in the classroom, you will be eligible to advance to a Professional License, the final level of licensure in South Carolina, if you have met state professional development and testing requirements (many of which you have the option to complete during your two years in the corps).
  - Alumni are responsible for submitting the application to advance their license, though our team will support you with information and guidance on the necessary steps.

## Teach for America

## What are the steps for a South Carolina professional certification?

- Professional Certification is the final level of licensure in South Carolina that will allow you to continue to teach in a South Carolina classroom as a fully certified teacher.
  - The steps to obtain your Professional Certification are:
- 1) Teach for at least one additional year beyond corps commitment in a Teach

  For America South Carolina affiliated district
- 2) Complete nine credit hours ("certification courses") with Teach For America South Carolina's university partner, Francis Marion University
  - 3) Pass the Principles of Learning and Teaching Praxis Exam
    - 4) Pass the district teacher evaluation process

- 1) Submit an application (https://www.southcarolinateachers.org)
- 2) 90 clock hours of Phase I: Classroom Readiness Training
- 3) Submit a **complete application for certification** to the SCDE. The application includes the following: application, fee, fingerprints, transcripts
- **4) Official PRAXIS test scores** submitted officially by ETS to the South Carolina Department of Education. The code is 8108.
- 5) Receive a Statement of Eligibility Letter from the South Carolina Department of Education and seek employment with a public school or public charter school.
- 6) Once hired, have employing district submit a Confirmation of Employment Form to the SCDE
- 7) Receive your first Teachers of Tomorrow alternative route teaching certificate.

### The Internship Year

The first year of employment is also known as the Internship Year. Teachers will be assigned a mentor and field supervisor. The first year will be under the supervision of Teachers of Tomorrow and the employing district.

## Career & Technical Education (CTE) Work-Based Certification

# CTE Career and Technical Education Work-Based Certificate

CTE work-based certification program enables individuals with industry work experience in certain career and technical fields to be eligible for employment as a 9-12 grade level teacher in a South Carolina public school district. Once enrolled in the program, participants will attend training institutes, enroll in coursework, and complete examinations while employed in a South Carolina public school district. Participants will have a maximum of five school years (July 1 - June 30) to complete all CTE work-based certification program requirements and earn a Professional work-based teaching certificate.

### To become eligible, all applicants must:

- •Be at least 18 years of age at the time of application
- Meet the minimum industry experience requirement for the requested workbased field
- •Complete the fingerprinting process and receive and "All Clear"
- •Earn the minimum of a high school diploma or GED.

Please be aware that some work-based fields require applicants to meet additional education requirements, such as holding an Associate's or Bachelor's degree.

Applying to the SCDE is a MUST when seeking a teaching certificate.

## Good to Know!

- Initial Certificate=First 3 years of teaching Induction=First year of teaching, receive
- Professional Certificate received after
- successfully completing Induction 1 and ADEPT evaluation for 3 years along with completion of program requirements

Requirements may vary slightly between programs.

However, everyone much submit the following to the SCDE:

- Online application
  - Fee of \$105
- Submit transcripts
  - Fingerprints
