Crockpot Salsa Chicken

This is my newgo-to" easy meal for dinner and more...

INGREDIENTS

4 boneless skinless chicken breasts

2 tsp. taco seasoning mix

2 c. chunky red salsa

Lime wedges, for serving

DIRECTIONS

Arrange chicken breast in slow cooker. Sprinkle all over with taco seasoning mix. Pour 1 cup of the salsa over seasoned chicken. Cover and cook on high for 3 hours (or low for 6-8 hours).

Use two forks to shred the chicken. Add remaining cup of salsa and toss to coat.

MORE:

-great over rice with some cheese and sour cream in a bowl

-Add drained black beans and corn the last hour of cooking for different flavor

-Roll up in tortillas, place in greased pan, cover with shredded cheese and back till bubbly

-Serve with refried beans

-Use green salsa, not red (different flavors)

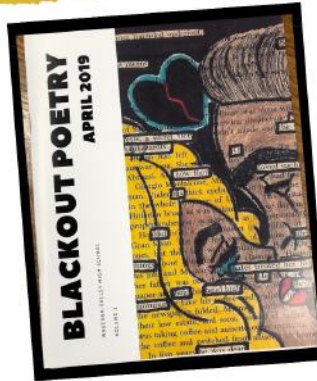

DRESS CODE FOR AWARDS CEREMONY & GRADUATION:

Males wear solid black dress pants, solid white button up dress shirts, solid black tie (no patterns or prints or bow ties), solid black dress shoes & socks, new cap, tassel and gown. The only visible jewelry will be class rings (no earrings, necklaces, piercings, etc.) No jeans, tennis shoes, or casual polo-style shirts may be worn. Females should wear white dresses that do not show above or below the gown, and solid white dress shoes. If hose are worn, only natural skin tones may be worn. The only visible jewelry will be class rings (Small earrings are okay, but no bracelets, necklaces, toe rings, piercings, etc). Flip flops are not dress shoes. Please make sure your toes and heel are not hanging over your shoes. All graduates will wear a new cap, gown, and tassel. Cell phones must be off. Honor Cords from the school only may be worn at Graduation and the Awards Ceremony. These rules for dress were established by the National Association of Secondary Principals so that the class of 2021 will be one unit and as much alike as possible. Any graduate not adhering to the dress code will not participate in the event, unless they can quickly adhere to the dress code. You may NOT decorate your cap.

* Plan ahead start shopping for the required attire early!! IF you do not adhere to the above dress code, you will NOT be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony.
